



* Some of these may be abundant at certain times of year, but not visible or easy to find at other times.

We also have some **non-native** plants that are excellent for pollinators and generally available to share

- Perennials: spearmint, oregano, raspberry, blackberry
- Edible annuals (can be dug when growing or seed collected to plant): mache (winter, early spring), holy basil (summer), sesame (summer), cilantro, dill, arugula, cress,
- Cut flowers: zinnia, Mexican sunflower, larkspur
